young guys like Lingard, Martial, Rashford and Scott McTominay. But you also need a combination with Nemanja Matic and Alexis, players with more experience, with more knowhow of being in the position of where we want to be - fighting for titles.

"Sanchez is a very important addition for us. Now we have five attacking players of high quality and that is fantastic for me and for the team.

"If one day some of the players are on the bench and don't like it, I'm happy with that."

Yeovil, struggling near the foot of League Two, should be a relatively easy introduction for Sanchez but Mourinho will treat them with respect by fielding a strong team.

Well aware that United were made to work hard before clinching a 2-0 third-round win under Louis van Gaal three years ago, he joked: "I will only be celebrating my birthday if we win."

numbers and Manchester City spent more money than us, Chelsea spent more money than us, I think even Everton spent more money than us. I don't think that's the problem.

"Expensive or cheap? Honestly, I think it was fair. I cannot say that it was expensive because it wasn't. I cannot say it was cheap because if you add all the values of his contract, it's not cheap. But it is a very good deal for us and the player has a fantastic contract. It's a contract according to his qualities as a player and according to the situation - no transfer fee.

"How much would Sanchez cost in a normal transfer, club-to-club, as a player with two or three years left on his contract? We look to the numbers now and I would say roughly between £100m and £150m. So you put things in perspective: you go

to the numbers that the club didn't pay on the transfer, you go to the numbers that the club pay in salaries, which are obviously higher than others. You get a calculator and you arrive into different conclusions.

"Alexis could have gone anywhere. He had lots of choices."

United officials were unaware of reports from Spain that Sanchez was missing when drugs testers turned up at Arsenal's training ground on Monday - because he was in Manchester completing his move.

United sources say it is a matter for the Gunners to have informed the anti-doping unit of the whereabouts of their players because, as of Monday morning, Sanchez was still technically their player.

Mourinho has dismissed reports in Spain linking Cristiano Ronaldo, above, with a return to Old Trafford.

"Cristiano is the kind of player every manager and club want but only one manager and one club can have him and he stays with Zidane and Real Madrid, that's my feeling," he said.

Mourinho has signed a one-year extension to his contract, with the option for a further season.

"I am delighted the owners feel that I am the right manager," he said.

after the FA deemed the club's appeal against his red card for an altercation with referee Kevin Johnson in the defeat by Chesterfield as "frivolous".

But Way hopes his side can reproduce the form they showed in their third-round win over League One play-off chasers Bradford.

"My players have enjoyed the FA Cup, to prove others wrong that they can play at that level," he said. "It is important the players show no fear. This is about us playing against Manchester United,

"United have been very supportive towards me, and certainly at my lowest point, a big thanks goes to Sir Alex,"

said Way, whose playing career was brought to an abrupt end following a serious car crash in 2008. "They have a touch of class with the way they deal with people who they can offer their services to.

"Without them I probably wouldn't be sat where I am now because they made my life easier for my family and I appreciate them bringing a team down. To now be going up against them as a manager, with Mourinho, it is an unbelievable story."
