

Why Yeovil's big night can make Jerry a true Blue

with more than the ICIS League title on his mind.

The 26-year-old Yeovil midfielder goes hunting a return to the Conference as the league's two juggernauts collide in a match with a big bearing on who takes the honours in May.

But watching Birmingham boss Trevor Francis will be running the rule over Gill as he ponders a pretransfer deadline raid to improve his already large squad.

Gill has played in three friendlies for Birmingham recently to add to his appearance for England in a semi-pro international in Dublin. A return to the professional game is on the cards.

"It's all very much up in the air but I am keen to get back into League football," said Gill, a rep for a sports supply company.

"If it comes to a choice between a job and football then it's got to be football. If I turned down the chance then, I would always be looking back and thinking of what might have been.

Should Birmingham follow-up their interest - £70,000 has been mentioned - it would be a second chance for Gill.

He left Southern League soccer as a teenager with Trowbridge to turn professional at Leyton Orient. Eighteen months later, a free transfer sent him back to the West Country a wiser man.

"Frank Clark signed me for Orient but I was very much the country boy moving to the big city," he recalled.

"I was a regular in the reserves but never got my chance in the first team. If I had, things might have been different.

"Whatever happens Birmingham, though, I will be with

Yeovil until the end of the season." Gill grew up quickly during five Conference years with Bath City.

"It is not the be all and end all of our season because there will still be a lot of football left to play.

Gill has taken advantage of manager Graham Roberts' insistence on a passing game to install himself as the side's third top scorer.

The Bristol student has netted 12 in 12 games since his £17,000 arrival mid-season from Oxford City.

Defender Chris White starts a two-match ban, Chris Seymour is out injured while skipper Micky Engwell has knee ligament damage.
